

From countryside to coast, Durham provides the perfect opportunity to pause, breathe, and savour our special place.

From walking and cycling to nature watching, watersports and wellness, take some tranquil time out in Durham.

Head to the Durham Dales to enjoy everything from a scenic stroll to a challenging trek, with lots of opportunities for wildlife watching along the way.

If you prefer to explore on two wheels you will find routes for all ages and abilities, and at Hamsterley Forest you can take on some of the best off-road cycling tracks in the UK.

If you want a challenge, a number of long-distance walking and cycling routes, including the Pennine Way, Northern Saints Trails and Sea to Sea, will take you through some of county's most stunning landscapes.

For spectacular sights don't miss High Force, one of England's most dramatic waterfalls, or enjoy an incredible night of stargazing under Durham's dark skies in the North Pennines National Landscape.




Explore Durham Cathedral, part of Durham's UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit the resting places of iconic Northern Saints, St Cuthbert and the Venerable Bede, as pilgrims have done for 1,000 years, and encounter the cathedral's daily rhythm of worship.

Look up to see stained glass windows, pause by the County Durham miners and local regiment memorials and explore the iconic Cloisters. Step into the cathedral's museum to explore the history of the medieval monastery, and see the treasures of St Cuthbert. Plus, see three rare Magna Cartas on display in Durham Cathedral Museum in summer 2025, celebrating the 800th anniversary of the 1225 issue.

Binchester Roman Fort









See the impressive remains of the Commandant's house and the neighbouring bath-house (now protected with a new cover building) containing one of the best preserved examples of a hypocaust (underfloor heating system) in the whole of Britain – and see the stupendously well–preserved remains of part of the regimental bath building uncovered by recent excavations.
