**Bat** Did you know every July to October Durham Cathedral cloister is home to large numbers of Pipistrelle Bats?




### Red Squirrel

Did you know this little butterfly can only be found on the Durham Coast?






**Little Tern** One of Britain's rarest and smallest seabirds can be spotted at Crimdon Beach from May to September.
